

Promoting Effective Management and Continuous Improvement of Head Start is a core component of the new HSPPS, where outcomes and impacts are used to demonstrate compliance and quality. This two-day training will focus on:

- Creating and sustaining an organizational culture that allows for agility in the face of change
- Considerations for implementation of the new regulations
- Strategies for supporting managers and staff with preparing for a Focus Area 1 or Focus Area 2 review
